PAR 4 HANDICAP 11/15

The shortest Par 3 on the golf course, and a pretty straightforward tee shot. It plays slightly downhill but pay attention to the wind. The key to making par on this hole is to not miss long off the tee.





PAR 3 HANDICAP 17/17



Three

One of the more challenging tee shots on the golf course. Trees line the fairway on both sides, so hitting the fairway is critical. Players will be left with an uphill approach shot to a large but challenging green that is well protected by a large bunker front right and a pot bunker to the left.







Four

One of the more fun tee shots at Cable Hollow, asis is an elevated tee shot that allows players to "tee it high and let it fly." Missing right off the tee is essentially dead and will leave players with a punch out. Good tee shots should leave players with a fairly straightforward approach shot to another one of our contoured greens.





PAR 4 HANDICAP 9/5

Five

At nearly 200 yards, and all uphill, the joke around here is that this is the "shortest Par 5 on the course" because many double-bogies on this Par 3 have been carded through the years. A long iron, or sometimes a wood off the tee, to a severely sloped back to front green makes this one of the more challenging holes on the course. A Par will go a long way here.







A slight dogleg left, the 6th hole is our shortest Par 5 on the golf course. Don't get too greedy, however, as this hole does have some teeth. Longer hitters should have no trouble reaching this devilish green in two but the golden rule for any approach shot here is do not go long!



PAR 5 HANDICAP 15 / 13 °480 °475 °421



Seven

The #1 handicap hole on the course is a fairly long straightaway Par 4 and generally plays into the wind. A good tee shot here will leave most with a mid to long iron or at times even a wood into a fairly large green protected by a bunker front left.





PAR 4 HANDICAP 1/3

Eight

A relatively short Par 4 with a healthy dogleg left, hitting a good tee shot here will leave players with one of the shorter approach shots on the course. Be careful off the tee, however, as three Pot bunkers protect the left side of this fairway. Don't fall asleep with your approach shot either, as the green is notected nicely by three large bunkers.





PAR 4 HANDICAP 13/11

•355 °346 °340 •316



A lengthy Par 5, players must give some thought off the tee as to whether they can carry the Pond with the Big Stick or need to lay up with something less than Driver. The entire right side of the hole is lined by trees and the 2nd shot is critical, as it will set up your approach shot into this deceiving green. Walking off this green with a 5 is a good score.









Ten

The back nine begins with a short Par 4 reachable off the tee for some. Trouble is still available, however, as there is OB left and some tree trouble down the right. Some players may choose to take less than a driver to avoid trouble and are still left with a relatively short approach shot into this green, heavily protected by three bunkers.







Eleven

A riskreward Par 4 for the Men and a very challenging Par 3 for the Ladies. At just 275 yards for the Men, a driver isn't required off the tee to set yourself up with a short approach shot. However, choosing a driver can set you up for a very short approach shot or even an Eagle Putt. Be careful though, as the road to the left is OB and could lead to a big number on this short hole.

At just 356 yards, the 12th Hole is our #2 handicaps hole. Not an overly difficult tee shot; the challenge on this hole comes from the approach shot. A large pond sits in front of this green and gives it all the protection it needs. If you're unsure of your club choice, choose one extra club to ensure your ball stays dry.





PAR 4 HANDICAP 2/4

Thirteen

A slight dogleg left Par 5, the key off the tee box is ton on miss left, as you will have tree trouble or even OB. Down the middle or even slightly right will leave you with a much better 2nd shot, but don't get no with a much better 2nd shot, as the OB lines the comfortable with your 2nd shot, as the OB lines the nettree left side or the hole. Longer bitters should have chance at reaching in two with a good tee shot and settingup a nice bridge changes





PAR 5 HANDICAP 10/8

Fourteen

A relatively short Par 4, the key off this tee box is to avoid the Cueumber Tree that guards the left side of the fairway. Good tee shots should leave most players with a short iron or wedge shot into this undulated green, which bears host to a false front and a devillsh little ridge on the left. Have I mentioned the green-side bunker in the front?





PAR 4 HANDICAP 16 / 12

Fifteen

A lengthy, but fairly straightaway Par 4. Trees line the fairway on both sides so a good tee shot is critical. Most players will have a mid to long iron approach shot into one of the largest greens on the course, which is slightly protected by a bunker to the left.





PAR 4 HANDICAP 4/6

Sixteen

Another one of our shorter, but challenging Par 'is. Players must come through the shoot off of the tee and avoid the forest of trees along the left and the batch of trees along the right. Once you've cleared that hurdle you will be left with a shorter approach shot into a two tiered green, which offers its own set of challenges. A two putt here is no easy task.





PAR 4 HANDICAP 6/18

•410 °330 °316 •246



Seventeen

The last of our Par 3's, the 17th hole is a semi lengthy Par 3 with a fairly large, but flat green protected by bunkers on each side of it. A mid to long iron off the tee is generally the club of choice here.







PAR 3 HANDICAP 12/16

•205 °175 •160 •130



Eighteen

A daunting tee shot, with OB that runs all along the entire left side of this hole and another batch of trees up along the right. Hitting a good tee shot here is critical in ending your round on a high note. Most folks lay up with their 2nd shot and leave themselves an uphill approach shot into another one of our large, undulated greens. A bunker protests the front left portion of this green. Walking off the 18th with a Par is a great way te end your round.

Practice

Every wird goffer knows that practice makes perfect. We offer the facilities you need to keep your game in top shape. Come hit a bucket of balls at our driving range to work on correcting that silice or break in your new set of clubs. Short game is arguably the most challenging element to the game of goff, but it is commonly the most neglected. With putting, pitching, and chipping making up roughly 60-70% of the shots in any given round, mastering short game can take strokes off your secore. Our putting green is great for practicing your short game and learning how to handle those critical and tricky shots.



Quick Tips Correcting Swing

HOOK

Play the ball back of your normal location and align the leading edge of the clubface square to the baseline of the inclined plane.

PULL HOOK


Play the ball at your normal location and close the clubface.

SLICE

Play the ball ahead of your normal location and align the leading edge of the clubface square to the baseline of the inclined plane.

PUSH SLICE

Play the ball at your normal location and open the clubface.
